Report by the Commanding Officer



Captain YUEN Ching-fong

It has been my great honour to be appointed as the Commanding Officer of the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps (the Corps) since March 2021. I am glad and proud to meet people from across spectrums with a similar view of the sea, of youth training and of voluntary efforts.

General Situation on Cadet Activities in 2021

Living under the influence of COVID pandemic during the first half of 2021, schools were closed and students were provided virtual classes. All school activities were cancelled and hence there was a total suspension of the Corps training and activities. With the government implementing measures to control the pandemics which were supported by the members of the public, the situation of pandemics were improving, allowing social and school activities to resume gradually in the second half of the year.

Living with stringent hygiene and social distancing requirements imposed by the Education Bureau, the Corps kept supporting and connecting the cadets through social media. Following the improved pandemic situation, virtual and normal TS meeting/training/activities were resumed gradually. During the second half of the year, the Corps started providing the cadets with an option to physically participate in programmes under a safe and controlled environment. Although turnout rates were affected by the government and schools restrictions on public gathering, parents and cadets have reflected their eagerness to resume the training /activities. It has been most rewarding and enjoyable to see the happy and smiley faces as well as hearing the laughter in the HQs and the nautical training centres.

Never fail to do anything good that you deem as petty, the Corps is



committed to develop positive values, self-respect and civic awareness of the youths as always.

Achievement of Volunteers in 2021

The Corps' Presentation Day was held on 21 August to acknowledge 28 officers who have given dedicated services over the years. They were awarded for the SCFM for the years of both 2019 and 2020, as well as SHA's Commendations 2019 and Grantham Uniformed Youth Groups Outstanding Service Award.

The Officers' Promotion Board was also successfully conducted in August 2021. The Corps has a number of well-deserved promotions which include 3 new promotees of Lieutenant, 2 Sub Lieutenant, 2 Midshipman and 1 Chief Petty Officer whose promotions were effective in October 2021.

The travel restriction did not stop international connections among ISCA members that the CO, both DCOs and the CSO attended the ISCA 2021 virtual exchange held between 20th and 23rd October. It was an eye opening experience through the sharings presented by ISCA members and an opportunity to reconnect new management teams of the ISCA members with each other.

Notwithstanding the decision of the SWD to retire its Volunteer Services Programme at the end of 2021, a commensurable acknowledgement regime will be developed by the Corps to convey appreciation to the volunteers for their selfishlessness and contributions.

Organisational Development

The Corps has strengthened its strategic development towards a Special Attachment Project (SAP) with the Marine Police in enhancing the synergy effect of youth development. This was developed through high level engagement of the Council members and Marine Regional Management as a starter in May 2021, then the establishment of a new unit, namely the Cougartek Unit in July 2021. Cougartek is a Police High Speed Interceptor vessel and naming the Corps' units with the vessel names of the Royal Navy



and now the Marine Police is one of the good traditions of the Corps. The SAP will also include a bonding developed between the Corps' Regions with Marine sea-going districts. The bonding will provide more opportunities for youngsters of the Corps to have regular and personal interactions with Marine Police officers where they can acquire maritime and law enforcement knowledge/information directly. Through the bonding, training resources such as facilities, venues and instructors can be shared and best training practices be exchanged. The establishment of the Cougartek Unit and the Bonding are key milestones of the Corps development.

Volunteers Development & Support through Refined Organizational Structure

With a well-developed volunteer team composed of committed, well-educated and trained volunteers, a breadth and diversity are created to strengthen the Corps and to meet challenges that Hong Kong society might face in the future. In this regard, it is important to maintain the quality volunteer team and thus it is of essence to further work on the training and development resources and hence the united Corps is able to support and contribute to the rest of our society.

We apply the strategy of "SEA" for the Corps development, this is Sustainability, to provide a succession platform for the Corps management team; Enrichment, to introduce a variety of personal training and development programmes for our members; and Advancement, to develop a continuous growing capability of our officers through introducing a secondment plan for new promotees.

To support this and for the further development of the Corps, a major review on the organisation structure was proposed and endorsed by the Executive Committee in October 2021. The new organizational structure adds value by including the emphasis on volunteer development and liaison to reach out to the community partners. Future development of the Corps counts internally on officers' sense of belonging, attitude and capability to project positive influence on young people, while externally relying on community support.



The Corps is working to give clearer missions and better financial support to engage the volunteer members, in particular the young officers aged between 20 and 40.

CORPS' BACKGROUND

The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps began to take shape in 1967 by a group of officers of the former Hong Kong Royal Naval Reserve. The formation of the Corps took place on 16th February 1968 and incorporated under the Hong Kong Law (Chapter 1134 – Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps Ordinance). The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps was modeled after and in affiliation with the Sea Cadet Corps of United Kingdom.

Since its inception, the Royal Navy in Hong Kong provided regular support for our officers and cadets, including training resources and facilities. On 1st July 1997, the Corps transformed into an independent uniformed youth organization of Hong Kong and has also been a full member of the International Sea Cadet Association since 1995.

AIMS

The Corps aims at providing nautical skill, team-building and discipline trainings to its cadet members through maritime activities and to equip them with self-respect, positive value, qualities of leadership, dedication to duty and civic awareness such that they will become contributing citizens of our community.

Apart from the normal scheduled training and outdoor activities, community services are also our main commitment. These include manpower assistance to the local charitable organizations for fund raising; providing cadets for crowd control duties during public celebrations and active participation in flag selling days.

Policy and directive to run the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps are formulated by the Executive Committee under the authority of the Area Committee, which is at present chaired by Ms. LEUNG Tze-wai Jeanie and comprises renowned members of the Hong Kong community who have genuine interest in the promotion of sea training and activities for young people.

The Commanding Officer, Captain Rebecca CF YUEN who is appointed by the Area Committee is the overall operational commander of the Corps. The day-to-day administration is undertaken by the Chief Staff Officer assisted by a team of full-time staff at our Diamond Hill Headquarters.

Expenditure 2020/21

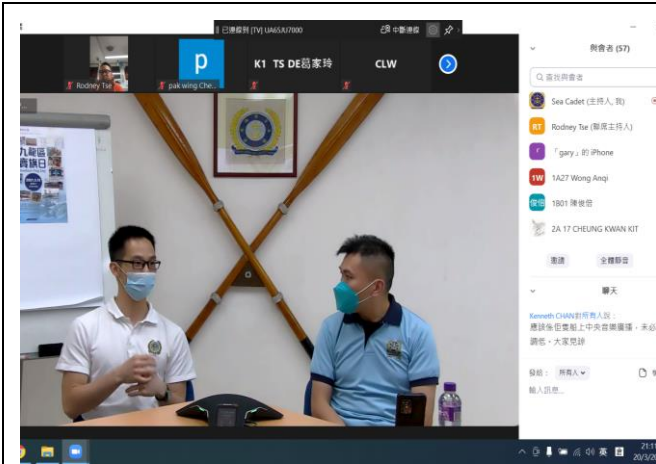
