Report by the Commanding Officer



Captain YUEN Ching-fong

It has been my privilege to serve the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps (the "Corps" or "HKSCC") as the Commanding Officer for the second year. During this slow return to normal life in the preceding year whilst under the shadow cast by the COVID pandemic, the Corps' activities have had to overcome substantial hurdles such as periodic school suspension and social distancing measures restricting activity participant numbers. I am proud of the Corps' resilience in not only surviving but also thriving during these challenging conditions. This report encapsulates our key developments in 2022.

Steering the SEA Strategy at HKSCC

The sea knows no boundaries. Bearing this idea in mind, we have steered our SEA strategy further and embed it in the operations and activities of the Corps throughout the year. Our "SEA" is: -

Sustainability

To focus on a succession mechanism to ensure the Corps remains a going concern.

Establishing a sound and effective organizational structure, as well as ensuring cadets' attachment to the Corps and the wider society are the backbones of our sustainability. In this aspect, we have made tremendous efforts at different levels to lay the foundations for our long-term continuous development. We have strengthened our development and training initiative by appointing Cdr. YIP Sui-pong as our new Deputy Commanding Officer who is responsible for driving this initiative forward. In addition, the deputy commander posts of the Five Regions and the Training Bureau were



established to reinforce better management in these areas. We are also actively seeking engagement and recruitment through new channels, such as the UG Recruitment Week of the Education University of Hong Kong, which are to be further explored in the coming year.

To further enhance the Cadets' sense of belonging, we have re-introduced the Outstanding Cadet Award and the Best Unit Award, aiming at identifying potential cadet leaders and Training Ships in recognition of their overall outstanding performance and contributions to the Corps. We continue to actively engage with our community, with an impressive achievement in charity services such as the Swimathon for St Joseph College; Dragon boat fund raising event with the Marine Police and the NT Walk 2022 for the Community Chest.

Enrichment

To introduce a variety of training programs and activities to appeal to the different interests of members.

The Corps always understands that fruitful and compelling experiences are pivotal to retaining cadets and appealing to new members.

Marine Guru Programme (MG Programme)

Subsequent to the bonding ceremony between the Marine Police of the HKPF and HKSCC in December 2021, the MG Programme was officially launched this year. With a bilateral cooperation purpose of promoting the development of our youth as contributing citizens in Hong Kong, this tailor-made bonding programme advocates the practicality of maritime knowledge. In the reporting year, our cadets had been given the opportunity to visit Marine Police operational bases, to be trained on seamanship onboard police vessels, etc., not to mention that it was our honor to have the Marine Police hosting the training classes for cadets to acquire both legal and practical nautical knowledge. The feedback from the participating cadets has been overwhelmingly positive.

Traditional, creative training and activities such as the Small Boat Training were undertaken between June and July 2022. The Drum Band and Guard Units' Activities for the 25A celebration event jointly organized by 20



Uniformed Groups and the Creative Dragon Boat Challenge Activities were also organized in 2022. The Corps has in addition continued the good tradition of participating in International exchanges with Sea Cadet Associations including the Singapore National Cadet Corps and the ISCA Annual Conference held by U.S. Naval Sea Cadet Corps, both through a virtual online platform.

Advancement

To cultivate a continuous development of the Corps members and the Corps in the growing competitive youth sectors.

The Corps constantly strives to equip our cadets to achieve continuous advancement in all areas of their lives so that they will become contributing citizens in our community. In this regard, we have placed a focus on fostering the next generation of management through the introduction of a Flyer Star Scheme, which is bespoke to members having received the Outstanding Cadet Award or entering into university or higher education. By positioning these potential future leaders on different functional panels, their voices and insights can be unleashed for us to materialise their ideas in actual policies at higher levels.

Hong Kong will prosper only when its young people thrive! The Hong Kong Government has rightly placed youth development as one of the focus areas of its policy address and there are six youth groups founded under the Disciplined Forces. Funded under the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau (HYAB), The Hong Kong Jockey Club Charities Trust and the Community Chest, the Corps is endeavoring to maintain the close bonds with the Government and the community partners who have placed special emphasis on national education.

Chinese Style March (CSM)

The performance of CSM has gradually becoming a trend in major youth activities and events held in Hong Kong. Developing our cadets with the capability so that they will be able to jointly perform with other youth groups in all youth activities and avenues, sourcing opportunities for our cadets to participate and shine on the stage, the Corps sees an imminent need to implement CSM into the Cadet training syllabus. This will be introduced



through an add-on new drill skillset, and as of the date of this report, there were altogether 12 officers and instructors trained by the Hong Kong Correctional Services Department, the Hong Kong Police Force and the Home and Youth Affairs Bureau. Hopefully, we will bolster our full CSM capacity by the end of 2024.

CORPS' BACKGROUND

The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps began to take shape in 1967 by a group of officers of the former Hong Kong Royal Naval Reserve. The formation of the Corps took place on 16th February 1968 and incorporated under the Hong Kong Law (Chapter 1134 – Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps Ordinance). The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps was modeled after and in affiliation with the Sea Cadet Corps of United Kingdom.

Since its inception, the Royal Navy in Hong Kong provided regular support for our officers and cadets, including training resources and facilities. On 1st July 1997, the Corps transformed into an independent uniformed youth organization of Hong Kong and has also been a full member of the International Sea Cadet Association since 1995.

AIMS

The Corps aims at providing nautical skill, team-building and discipline trainings to its cadet members through maritime activities and to equip them with self-respect, positive value, qualities of leadership, dedication to duty and civic awareness such that they will become contributing citizens of our community.

In general, training and activities are conducted during the weekends and school holidays, which include:

Apart from the normal scheduled training and outdoor activities, community services are also our main commitment. These include manpower assistance to the local charitable organizations for fund raising; providing cadets for crowd control duties during public celebrations and active participation in flag selling days.



MANAGEMENT & ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURES

Policy and directive to run the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps are formulated by the Executive Committee under the authority of the Area Committee, which is at present chaired by Ms. LEUNG Tze-wai Jeanie and comprises renowned members of the Hong Kong community who have genuine interest in the promotion of sea training and activities for young people.

The Commanding Officer, Captain Rebecca CF YUEN who is appointed by the Area Committee is the overall operational commander of the Corps. The day-to-day administration is undertaken by the Chief Staff Officer assisted by a team of full-time staff at our Diamond Hill Headquarters.

Expenditure 2021/22

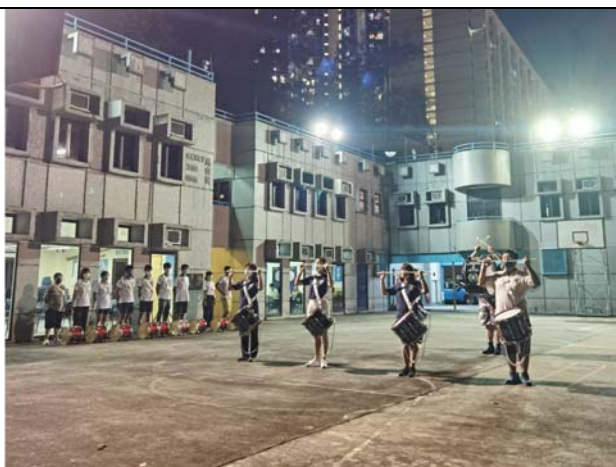

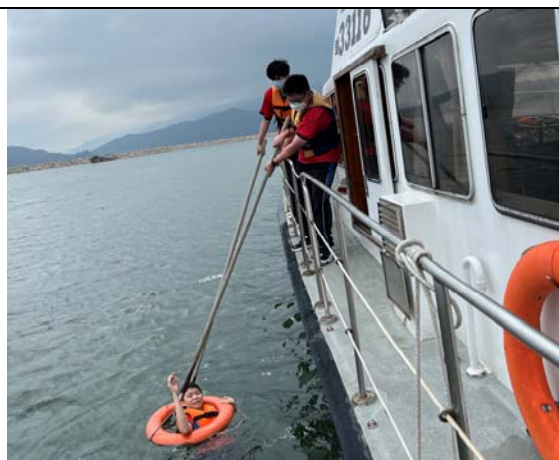
