Report by the Commanding Officer

Introduction

It is with great pride that I present the 2025 Annual Report of the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps (HKSCC). This year has been marked by transformation, innovation, and consolidation. As we navigate an increasingly complex and competitive youth development landscape, the Corps has remained steadfast in its mission to nurture disciplined, civic-minded, and maritime-aware young citizens. Through strategic reforms and renewed partnerships, we have laid a stronger foundation for sustainable growth and enhanced societal impact.

Advancing with Purpose: HKSCC 2.0

In 2025, we have prepared to launch the HKSCC 2.0, a strategic initiative designed to modernize our structure and deepen our impact. The initiative focuses on the following key priorities:

- Strengthen organizational values and core principles
- Strengthening our public image to attract the next generation of youth
- Expanding our influence and deepening community engagement

To ensure these priorities are reflected in our training philosophy, we have formally adopted **four core training pillars** that define the developmental journey of every cadet:

Maritime Training

Cadets receive foundational knowledge in seamanship, navigation, water safety, and maritime culture, instilling respect for the sea and preparing them for future service or study in maritime fields.

First Aid Training

Through certified training and practical simulations, cadets acquire life-saving skills and a strong sense of civic responsibility. The HKSCC First Aid Team exemplifies this pillar in action.

Foot drill and Military Band

Discipline, precision, and teamwork are cultivated through structured foot drills and musical training. These activities also enhance public representation and ceremonial excellence.

Holistic Development

Beyond technical skills, cadets are nurtured in leadership, ethics, communication and community service, ensuring they grow into well-rounded, socially responsible citizens. Together, these pillars reinforce the Corps' commitment to excellence, tradition and youth empowerment. They serve as the operational backbone of HKSCC 2.0, guiding programme design, resource allocation and cadet progression.

A Revision of Our Core Values

To cultivate a distinctive culture and strengthen internal cohesion, we have formally adopted the HKSCC Core Value Charter, which serves as a guiding framework for conduct, training and outreach. These values are expressed as follows:

H – Honesty (誠實)

K – Knowledge (知識)

S – Self-Discipline (自律)

C – Courage (勇氣)

C – Commitment (承諾)

This bilingual presentation reinforces our identity while ensures clarity across diverse audiences. These values will be embedded in all aspects of Corps life—from recruitment and training to leadership development and public engagement.

Uniform Standardization

To foster a stronger sense of identity and alignment with PLA, the Corps officially adopted a standardized uniform style modeled after the PLA Navy. This update applies to both cadets and adult members, symbolizing unity, discipline and pride. The new uniform has been well received and has elevated the Corps' professional image during public appearances and ceremonial duties.

First Aid Training and Service Team

In collaboration with the Hong Kong Association for Conflict and Catastrophe Medicine (香港危難應變醫學會), we introduced a comprehensive First Aid Training Course tailored for our cadets and officers. This initiative equips members with life-saving skills and reinforces our commitment to both community service and emergency preparedness.

Building on this foundation, we proudly established the HKSCC First Aid Team, composed of experienced first aiders from within our ranks. This team is now actively deployed to support Corps events and external community activities, enhancing our service capacity and visibility.

Expanding Membership: Junior Sea Cadet

Recognizing the importance of early maritime education, we lowered the entry age from 12 to 9 for cadet membership to include primary school students. This reform allows us to instill maritime awareness, discipline and civic values from an early age, ensuring a deeper and longer-lasting developmental journey for our youth. To support this, we designed a brand-new uniform tailored for younger members, designed to be both functional and appealing to younger members.

Leadership Development

Our efforts to identify potential leaders for the Corps are strengthening. In line with this goal, we conducted the Outstanding Cadet Award, the Best Unit Award, the Grantham Uniformed Youth Groups Outstanding Service Award, and a Promotion Board in September. These initiatives are specifically designed to recognize the remarkable accomplishments and valuable contributions of our officers and cadets, further strengthening the foundation for the Corps' continued success.

Community Service

We have been actively engaged with the community by taking part in various social charity events. Notably, we participated in activities such as the Hong Kong International Dragon Boat Race, St. Joseph's College 150th Anniversary Green & White Swimathon, the Remembrance Day Ceremony at Cenotaph, the observance of Poppy day, the Community Chest Flag Day, the Coastal Environmental Conservation Cleaning at Sai Kung, and the distribution of lucky bags to elderly residents at Tai O.

Enrichment

We introduced a variety of training programmes and activities to cater the diverse interests of our members. Marine Guru Programme (MG Programme) is a tailored bonding initiative between the Marine Police of HKPF and HKSCC, aimed at nurturing our youth as responsible citizens of Hong Kong, with a strong emphasis on the practical application of maritime knowledge.

To better support the SEN cadets in our Corps, we organized Special Educational Needs (SEN) training course for both instructors and officers in June. The aim of this course is to help our trainers better understand the needs of SEN children and learn how to address related challenges. We believe this course will equip our instructors and officers to guide cadets more effectively in the future.

Exchange

We successfully reinstated and carried out a comprehensive array of exchange programmes, both inbound and outbound, with outstanding achievements. These exchange programmes have significantly cemented the cultural cultivation of international camaraderie among our cadets, including an invitation for an exchange with 2 officers and 11 cadets to Sea Explorers of Korea from July 22 to August 4. Moreover, we had the honour of hosting the inbound exchange programme in August in Hong Kong with a total of 175 participants. Among them, 7 were from Korea, 15 were from Singapore, 5 were from Japan, 4 were from South Africa and 120 were from 溫州. Besides, it is worth mentioning that the "Bound by Unity: Journey Across Million Miles"(同心同根萬里行) programme, organised by the Heart to Roots Association, took 3 officers and 23 cadets on a memorable trip to Beijing and Shandong, China from July 19 to 27. Additionally, we received an invitation from 香港各界青少年活動委員會 to participate in the commemorative activities of 80th Anniversary of the Victory in the Chinese People's War of Resistance Against Japanese Aggression and the World Anti-Fascist War at Beijing from October 16 to 19.

National Security Education

In commemoration of the 5th Anniversary of the enactment of the National Security Law, our Corps has actively participated in a series of thematic activities. These include the Flag Raising Ceremony by Disciplined Services and Youth Groups to mark this significant milestone, as well as discussions and workshops focused on five years of national security achievements, including insights tailored for individuals with special educational needs. Our Corps' active engagement in these activities has yielded remarkable results in enhancing awareness, fulfilling social responsibilities, and promoting understanding of the law.

Establishment of the Honorary Officers System

To further deepen community ties, the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps has initiated the development of a formal **Honorary Officers System**, inspired by successful models in the Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps and the Hong Kong Adventure Corps.

To ensure effective coordination and continuity, we will establish a dedicated **Honorary Officers Coordination Bureau**, operating under the direct supervision of the Commanding Officer. This Bureau will oversee nominations, appointments, engagement activities, and strategic alignment with HKSCC 2.0.

By formalizing this structure, we reaffirm our commitment to excellence, tradition and community service, while expanding our leadership network to support the Corps' long-term development and community impact.

CORPS' BACKGROUND

The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps began to take shape in 1967 by a group of officers of the former Hong Kong Royal Naval Reserve. The formation of the Corps took place on 16th February 1968 and incorporated under the Hong Kong Law (Chapter 1134 – Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps Ordinance). The Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps was modeled after and in affiliation with the Sea Cadet Corps of United Kingdom.

Since its inception, the Royal Navy in Hong Kong provided regular support for our officers and cadets, including training resources and facilities. On 1st July 1997, the Corps transformed into an independent uniformed youth organization of Hong Kong and has also been a full member of the International Sea Cadet Association since 1995.

AIMS

The Corps aims at providing nautical skill, team-building and discipline trainings to its cadet members through maritime activities and to equip them with self-respect, positive value, qualities of leadership, dedication to duty and civic awareness such that they will become contributing citizens of our community.

Apart from the normal scheduled training and outdoor activities, community services are also our main commitment. These include manpower assistance to the local charitable organizations for fund raising; providing cadets for crowd control duties during public celebrations and active participation in flag selling days.

MANAGEMENT & ORGANISATIONAL STRUCTURES

Policy and directive to run the Hong Kong Sea Cadet Corps are formulated by the Executive Committee under the authority of the Area Committee, which is at present chaired by Ms. LEUNG Tze-wai Jeanie and comprises renowned members of the Hong Kong community who have genuine interest in the promotion of sea training and activities for young people.

The Commanding Officer, Captain Terence SW CHOW who is appointed by the Area Committee is the overall operational commander of the Corps. The day-to-day administration is undertaken by the Chief Staff Officer assisted by a team of full-time staff at our Diamond Hill Headquarters.


Income and Expenditure 2024/25
